My aim is to build a network of improved roads and footpaths, with dropped kerbs for those who use mobility scooters. I want to stop motorists from leaving cars parked unreasonably and blocking free use of the footpath. I want to promote parking management schemes and speed restrictions to keep pedestrians and all road users safe. If re-elected I will carry on with my programme of continuous improvement.

I have faced many challenges over the last 4 years. Perhaps the biggest has been getting the second bridge built on Featherbed Lane. This has involved continued nagging of the various authorities and budget holders involved. I have taken on tasks with a mixture of County and Borough involvement, helped by my also being a Borough Councillor.

I have lived in Hemel Hempstead for over 30 years, all but one year of this in Boxmoor and the Hemel Town area. I am married with 3 children and 5 grandchildren. I have been your county councillor since 2012, and a Borough Councillor since 2007. My role in both councils has been mainly in Scrutiny and Audit, which means that I can question council decisions, and investigate how the council is run, to ensure that you, the residents, get the best possible value for money, and quality of services.

As a result of my long-standing interest in health matters, I have also taken a role in promoting business and mental health.
