 Conservatives

Wood Lane End

Wood Lane End has always suffered from the problem of traffic using it as a short cut to the motorway along with the inappropriate use of the narrow road by large commercial vehicles despite there being a 7.5m limit along part of the lane. This has got considerably worse with the construction of the new warehouse development along Buncefield Lane and this has led to a request from local residents for action to resolve the ongoing problems.

In response, Hertfordshire County Council as highway authority has consulted on options to resolve the issue and following the consultation it has been agreed to implement a closure along part of the lane. But access will be maintained for pedestrians and cyclists. Measures will also be introduced to prevent HGV access from the new development to Breakspear Way (past the cemetery entrance) and all of this work is due to be completed this spring.



Parking

Parking continues to be a headache throughout Hemel, but particularly in roads bordering Maylands, where large numbers of workers seek parking places for the whole of the working day, to the annoyance of residents. Some of these roads, such as Masons Road, are quite narrow and people have taken to parking on the verges. This has led to complaints from residents to our MP that the grass verges are being churned up. There are 2 possible mitigation measures; either some kind of “No Parking” scheme or verge hardening. The problem with parking schemes, including yellow lines, is that they take a very long time to implement through the County Council, whereas verge hardening can largely be handled by Dacorum. Your Councillors will be consulting you shortly on your preferred option.
