About half the parish responded to the Parish Survey.

Councillor John Morrish said “On behalf of the team behind the survey, I would like to thank everyone who took part for the phenomenal amount of feedback”.

“It will take a while to collate all the results, but they will provide evidence for the Parish Council’s future decisions.”

“Many improvements cost considerably more than could be afforded through the Parish Precept, but the survey results will help us to prioritise the resources that are available.”

Parish Precept Frozen



The Parish part of Council Tax has been frozen for 2019/20.

Councillor Alan Anderson said “It shows that at a local level we can be trusted to run public matters as cost-effectively as possible”.

Tidying the Village Garden



A Parish Council three year plan to improve the Village Garden is nearing completion.

Councillor Alan Johnson said “A lot of work has gone into removing the ivy and general overgrowth around the garden to make it an even more valuable asset for the Parish”.

“Some minor issues still need sorting, but the work has brought much more light to the garden, opened up views of All Saints, and made the garden much more welcoming than it was.”

Seeking Road Improvements

The Parish Council is not responsible for roads, but has been trying to obtain road maintenance & improvements.

Councillor Howard Button (Chairman of the Parish Council) said “Even before the recent collisions on the corner of Vicarage Lane and the High Street, we were lobbying the County Council to move the traffic lights outside the Spar shop to the Hempstead Rd/Vicarage Ln/Nap crossroads”.



MSAs Update

Preliminary plans for an online Motorway Service Area on the M25 between junctions 16 & 17 are gathering pace.

A planning application for an offline MSA just to the South of Junction 20 was due to be submitted to Three Rivers DC, but fortunately nothing has been heard of it as yet.

Councillor Rene De Silva (Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council’s Planning Committee) said “Councillors attended a recent consultation event to support the Jn 16/17 scheme”.



Did You See Santa?

With Community Action Dacorum, the Parish Council ran another successful High Street Christmas Lights Festival in December.

Councillor Bob McLean said “I would like to thank everyone who helps run the event and makes it the *annual* village event that it is”.
